I had forgotten to mention that Mr. Albert has had  
boxes no 16 traced, and I have ~~now no receipt~~. He  
sent 16 boxes in all, so if you received only 15, one  
must be missing, and we thought it would have  
been no 16. As this is not the case, he instructed  
the post office to trace all 16 boxes.

I see from the Consular paper, which I am inclosing  
herewith that Mr. Albert has made the technical  
mistake of calling his Ké-tu Chien Sung instead  
of Sung. It makes no difference to the Am. Customs,  
and I merely call your attention to it as it is  
a clerical error on his part. The Ké-tu is Sung.
